Scope: This bid is for a term and supply contract on a per unit basis (square yard) for various types of asphalt work that the District may require in a given year. The bid includes an equipment mobilization cost to address the relatively high cost of delivering paving and rolling equipment to a job site. This bid makes it possible for the District to act as a licensed general contractor for its own development, repair and improvement projects with the successful bidder(s) serving as subcontractors to the District. This allows a savings to the District on overhead and profit costs normally paid to the general contractor to manage a project. This contract is also utilized to complete work for smaller projects that are not cost effective for general contractors to bid as stand-alone general contracts and for projects that arise in the operations and maintenance of parks that do not require full design and engineering documents such as replacement of existing pavement. The contract allows for award to a primary contractor and supplementary contractor(s) based upon the lowest unit pricing offered by the bidder on each item. Supplementary contractors bidding on items, but not exceeding the Superintendent's Estimate, may be awarded those items and assigned the work if the primary contractor is unable to meet the construction schedule of a given job. This may be due to other project commitments within the District or within other sectors. The District has been utilizing a similar bid since 2007.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS: Staff recommend Updike Paving Corporation as the Primary Contractor with the overall lowest bid. Additionally, staff recommend Blacktop Paving & Construction LLC, who submitted the next lowest overall bid, as the Secondary Contractor, should Updike be unable to perform the work as scheduled (see Scope above for further explanation of Primary and Secondary).
